TO PROHIBIT NUISANCES AND DISORDERLY CONDUCT IN THE BOROUGH OF
MILLVILLE

Sec. 1. Be it ordained by the Chief Burgess and Town Council of the Borough of Millville and is hereby enacted by authority of the same, That any and every person committing any of the offenses hereinafter enumerated and specified and being duly convicted thereof before the Chief Burgess of said Borough or before any Justice of the Peace within said Borough, shall forfeit and pay the several fines and penalties hereinafter specified viz:

Sec. 2. Any and every person found within the limit of the Borough of Millville, in a state of intoxication or drunkenness shall for every such offence pay a fine of not less that Two nor more that Five Dollars.

Sec. 3. Any and every person found within the limits of said Borough, fighting, quarreling or inciting others to fight or quarrel and every person making an assault, or assault and battery upon the person of another within the limits of said Borough shall for every such offence forfeit and pay a fine of not less than Three nor more than Five Dollars.

Sec. 4. Any and every person engaged or participating in any riot, rout or tumult or affray or inciting thereto, within the limits of said Borough shall forfeit and pay a fine of not less that Five nor more that Twenty Dollars.

Sec. 5. All persons are hereby forbidden to assemble in front of any church, meeting house, hall or place of worship, amusement or entertainment or upon any of the bridges, street, sidewalls or alleys, within the limits of the said Borough, and each and every person so found assembled or congregated in front of any church, meeting house or other place of worship or entertainment or upon any bridge, street, sidewalk or alley within said Borough, he, she or they on conviction thereof shall forfeit and pay a fine of Two Dollars for each offence.

Sec. 6. Any and every person found within the limits of the Borough of Millville acting in a disorderly, loud or indecent manner or shall play at cards or any other game which tends to the manifest corruption of youth and production of vice, idleness and immorality and against the common good, he, she or they so offending shall on

conviction thereof forfeit and pay a fine of Five Dollars for each offence.

Sec. 7. The High Constable and each of the police officers of said Borough are required to be on the streets during the day and evening of any public gathering and are hereby authorized and empowered to arrest any and every person or persons found offending against this ordinance or any section thereof, without warrant, upon his view and such person or persons so offending to take and carry before the Chief Burgess or any Justice of the Peace of said Borough and any officer or officers neglecting or refusing to carry out the provisions of this ordinance shall on conviction forfeit and pay a fine of One Dollars for each refusal or neglect.
