

RELATING TO NUISANCES IN THE BOROUGH OF MILLVILLE

Sec. 1. Be it ordained by the Chief Burgess and Town Council of the Borough of Millville and is hereby enacted by authority of the same, That if any person shall erect or maintain any hog sty or any other nuisance in said Borough in such manner or situation that the smell thereof shall be offensive to his, her or their neighbors or any other citizens, and being thereof convicted shall forfeit and pay the sum of One Dollar for every such offense, and the further sum of One Dollar for every week the same is suffered to remain thereafter.

Sec. 2. That if any horses, mules, cattle, hogs, pigs, sheep, or geese are found running at large in said Borough, the same may be taken up immediately, impounded, and advertised by the High Constable, for which service he shall receive the sum of Fifty cents payable by the owner of the animal so impounded or out of the proceeds of the sale thereof. If the owner appears before the expiration of Ten Days and pays all charges, as herein contained, may remove the animal.

The charges shall be as follows: Twenty-five cents for the use of the Borough, Fifty cents for the person so taking up and impounding for each and every hog, as well as Twenty-five cents for each head per day for keeping and every shote and pig so impounded shall be charged the above sum except the keeping of the same per day which shall be Fifteen cents per head.

The High Constable in his advertisement giving Ten Days notice of impounding of an animal shall add the time and place of sale of such animal impounded which may be in the evening of the said tenth day and not later than the eleventh day unless that shall fall on Sunday when the sale shall take place on the Monday following.

The proceeds of such sale shall be appropriated as follows: All the above charges shall first be paid together with six per centum for selling and the remainder shall be paid by the High Constable into the Borough Treasury for the use of the owner if demanded within six months after the sale. If not demanded within the said time, then the sum shall belong to the said Borough. Furthermore it is hereby made the duty of the High Constable, under the penalty of One Dollar for neglect of duty if called upon to impound any animal running at large in the streets or alleys of said Borough contrary to the ordinance thereof.
