ORDINANCE NO. 51

WHEREAS, it has been brought to the attention of Millville Borough Council that the following Borough Ordinance passed and approved on the 25th day of April, 1896, but not legally signed by the officers of said Borough, and that their legality might be questioned if any attempt was made to enforce the, namely:

- No. 1 To prevent the obstruction of sidewalks and crossings, etc.
- No. 2 To prevent the destruction of bills and posters, etc.
- No. 3 To regulate fast driving, etc.
- No. 5 Relating to poultry found trespassing, etc.

- No. 7 To prohibit gambling, etc.
- No. 8 To regulate public exhibits, etc.
- No. 9 To prohibit public nuisances, disorderly conduct, etc.
- No. 10 To prohibit the sale and discharge of fireworks, etc.
- No. 11 Relating to nuisances, hog styes, animals at large, etc.

- No. 15 Regulating the riding of bicycles, etc.

No. 39 The Borough Council seeks State aid, etc.

AND WHEREAS ACT NO 6 Pamphlet laws of Pennsylvania, Page 9, passed the 3rd day of March 1925, among other things, provides for the validation of ordinances that have not been properly signed, within the meaning of the law, and that such ordinances shall be in full force and effect without any further signing, posting, or publication upon council of said Borough passing a resolution accepting this act, which resolution shall be approved by the Chief Burgess, published as ordinances are now required by existing laws to be published, posted and transcribed in the Ordinance Book of said Borough.

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED, BY THE Chief Burgess and the Town Council of the Borough of Millville, and it is enacted by the authority of the same, that the Borough Council now and hereby accept Act No. 6 P.L. 9 for the purpose of having the above mentioned ordinances, numbered 1 to 39 inclusive become valid, existing ordinance of the Borough of Millville, Pennsylvania.
