

TAKE NOTICE that at its regularly scheduled meeting to be held the 29th day of December, 1981, at the Millville Borough Hall, State Street Millville, Pennsylvania, at 6:00 O'clock P.M., the Council of the Borough of Millville will consider for enactment an ordinance increasing water and sewer rates in the Borough of Millville. The Ordinance will provide as follows:

DOMESTIC AND COMMERCIAL  
FLAT RATE SCHEDULE

All Consumers who have no meters as of January 1, 1982 and subsequent thereto or who have meters that are not working shall be charged according to the flat rate schedule. The flat rate schedule shall be as follows; (a) All consumers having a maximum 1/4 inch service or a 5/8 inch meter not working (whichever is larger) shall be charged a flat rate of \$23.68 per quarter. (b) All consumers having a maximum 1 inch service or 1 inch meter not working shall be charged a flat rate of \$35.50 per quarter. (c) All consumers having a maximum 1-1/2 inch service or 2 inch meter not working (whichever is larger) shall be charged a flat rate of \$96.55 per quarter. Where the foregoing connections are for fire service only, only charges under the Fire Service Schedule shall be made. The flat rate schedule shall also apply to consumers having newly installed meters or repaired meters until the beginning of the next meter reading period following the period in which the respective meter was installed or repaired.

DOMESTIC AND COMMERCIAL  
METER RATE SCHEDULE

All consumers who have working meters on January 1, 1982 or who are furnished with working meters thereafter shall be charged according to the following meter rate schedule per quarter:  
Up to the first 2,500 gallons, \$18.35;  
The next 2,500 gallons at the rate of \$1.40 per thousand gallons;  
The next 5,000 gallons at the rate of \$1.05 Per thousand gallons;  
All water over 10,000 gallons at the rate of \$.70 per thousand gallons.

COMMON METER RATE SCHEDULE

Each landlord who maintains one meter serving tenant consumers shall be charged for all consumers using the meter (including the landlord if connected to the meter). Such charge shall be the applicable gallons and rates under the Domestic and Commercial Meter rate Schedule, both multiplied by the number of consumers using the meter. In such

cases the landlord shall be responsible for the payment of such water charges to the Borough.

#### FIRE SERVICE SCHEDULE

From and after October 1, 1980, fire service connections shall be charged according to the following fire service schedules per quarter:

Municipal fire hydrants, \$15.00 per hydrant;

Private fire service; for each outside hydrant, \$12.38 for each inside hose connection, \$3.09;

Automatic sprinkling or other special service for fire protection,

For each 1 inch connection, \$5.94,

For each 1-1/2 inch connection, \$8.91,

For each 2" connection, \$14.85,

For each 3 inch connection, \$23.76,

For each 4" connection, \$37.13,

For each 6" connection, \$80.19.

In addition, the Ordinance will set sewage rates to remain at the October 1, 1980 rate, 75% of the water billing, with a minimum of \$18.75 per quarter. Property owners connected to the public sewer system that are not connected to the water system will be charged \$25.00 per quarter.
