ORDINANCE NUMBER 114-9212

AN ORDINANCE OF THE BOROUGH OF MILLVILLE REGULATING THE
DISCHARGE OF
CERTAIN WASTE WATERS THAT CANNOT BE ACCEPTED BY THE SEWAGE
SYSTEM

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WHEREAS, the Borough of Millville, hereinafter called the Borough, is licensed by the Department of environmental Resources to process a limited amount of sewage, AND

WHEREAS spring water, storm water, surface water, ground water, roof runoff, subsurface drainage, building foundation drainage, drainage from roof leaders connections, cooling water and unpolluted industrial process water overload the limits of the sewage systems, AND

WHEREAS said water present a hazard to pedestrian and vehicular traffic when discharged onto the street of sidewalk, NOW THEREFORE

BE IT HEREBY ORDAINED that no person shall discharge or cause to be discharged said waters into the Borough's public sewage system, AND

BE IT FURTHER ORDAINED that said waters shall be discharged into storm sewers or to a natural outlet approved by the Borough.

After being duly advertised, this Ordinance is enacted at a regular meeting of the Borough Council on this 15th day of December, 1992.
